Heart S1 and S2 present. Right foot dressing on his foot. Dressing clean and intact. Examine the patient today for Urinary tract infection. Monitor Ampicillin and sulfamethoxazole. No nausea or diarrhea was reported by the RN. No chest pain. No respiratory distress noted.
